Land Steward Fellowship

Program Summary

The Land Steward Fellowship will be offered to indigenous peoples who are interested in learning and gaining more insight of land stewardship and leadership. We hope this opportunity strengthens pathways for fellows to cultivate leadership and gain the skills and training to begin the process of rebuilding healthy and vibrant culturally sustainable and regenerative communities.

This 6-month fellowship program was created to support individuals who are actively engaged in land based practices that uphold our responsibility as Indigenous peoples. As a community-based organization it is our obligation to offer resources and opportunities to people who are capable and ready for the next step with their projects or activities that they have been working on or involved with. The fellowship will be geared toward individuals who feel prepared for the next steps, however they may need extra support and encouragement to help these projects and ideas come to fruition. We would like to support those individuals who have been working on creating creative solutions to land-based practices.

Participants will be involved in hands-on activities, leadership building, training, and networking within and outside the community. This fellowship will also offer succession planning to make space for the nurturing and cultivating of the future that the fellows would like to see in tribal communities. The fellowship will be designated as a recognition for those who have exemplified excellence in land stewardship and land tenure. The fellows that are accepted will be able to gain more support, resources, and experience in the areas that they are interested in while receiving monetary support for their efforts. Fellows will also be responsible for engaging in a mentorship component and will receive a mentor who will be someone to help guide them and be there as another pillar of support throughout the duration of the fellowship.

Program Objectives

The goal of the fellowship is to be able to support individual projects and offer a dollar amount for each fellow. We will offer resources, training, and educational opportunities around topics and projects that the fellows are interested in. It is also important to create and offer spaces for fellows to feel supported and heard within their work and communities. The fellowship will also offer mentorship opportunities for fellows to have an elder and peer mentor that they can go to throughout their fellowship. Through the fellowship program we hope to provide the fellows with the support needed to feel equipped to face the challenges in indigenous societies.

Program Curriculum

Programming for the fellowship will encompass an array of training, excursions, and learning opportunities. The curriculum will focus on the dynamics of understanding the cycles and impact that land-based practices have on all realms of life. It is important for fellows to understand the importance of what it means to have reverence for the land. The fellowship would like to create a curriculum that is relevant and intentional to the work of the fellows. Training and activities will be required for all of the fellows to participate.

Fellowship curriculum will include:

- Mentoring
- Succession planning
- Watershed protection and restoration
- Hopi Lavayi
- Traditional clanship land tenure and stewardship
- Biodiversity of the SW region including flora/fauna
- Local native plant identification and herbarium
- Traditional hunting practices
- And more!

Mentor Council

To provide guidance and mentorship for our first cohort of Fellows and so that our Fellows feel supported and nurtured within their work with the Hopi Tutskwa Land Steward Fellowship, we will identify and recruit a Mentor Council made up of 2 peers and 2 elders. Mentors will be identified by their work and success around land/watershed protection, restoration, sustainable community-based agriculture, and traditional ecological knowledge. Mentors will be people from the community who are involved in leadership development and share a vision of strengthening the community. This Mentor Council will meet with fellows bi-weekly at the start of the fellowship and continue on with individual and group meetings through the duration of the fellowship. The Mentorship Council will be actively involved throughout the duration of the Fellowship and after for feedback.

Participant Criteria

The focus of implementing the Land Steward Fellowship is to further support indigenous peoples within and outside our community who have taken strong leadership roles/initiatives to design, develop and work towards land and watershed protection, restoration, and sustainable community-based agriculture. We would like to support alumni and community members who are actively engaged in land based practices that uphold our responsibility as Indigenous peoples. As a

community- based organization it is our obligation to offer resources and opportunities to people who are capable and ready for the next step with their projects or activities that they have been working on or involved with who need extra support and encouragement to help these projects and ideas come to fruition.

Criteria:

- Alumni and or familiarity with HTPI Programming.
- Support Mission and Vision of HTPI
- Alumni, community members, and/or individuals outside the Hopi community who are actively providing leadership within their families and community.
- Alumni, community members, and/or individuals outside the Hopi community who share similar sustainable land stewardship goals and vision with HTPI.
- Alumni, community members, and/or individuals outside the Hopi community who share
 a vision of strengthening the community through land stewardship.
- Alumni, community members, and/or individuals outside the Hopi community who are
 positive role models and are actively involved in land stewardship practices.

Participant Commitment

Fellows will be able to demonstrate that they have the capacity to take leadership in their communities and create projects that fit into the vision of HTPI. Fellows will be committed to finishing the duration of the fellowship and be committed to fulfilling their projects. Fellows will be responsible for proper time and money management with the financial support they will be receiving on behalf of HTPI Land Steward Fellowship Programming. Fellows are responsible for upholding a positive and insightful relationship with all members of the Mentor Council. Fellows are expected to schedule and attend meetings with mentors. Fellows are expected to attend at least 90% of training sessions, fellowship meetings and activities.

In-Person Interview

Part of the selection process will be an in-person interview. This interview will be held with the Selection Committee before the final selection. Once your application packet is received we will schedule a meeting with you so you can schedule an interview time with the selection committee. The purpose of the interview process is to get to know the applicants and evaluate if they would be a good fit for the fellowship and able to commit to the entirety of the program.

Application Deadline
